Polish Veterans and Displaced Poles Monument – Regina, SK

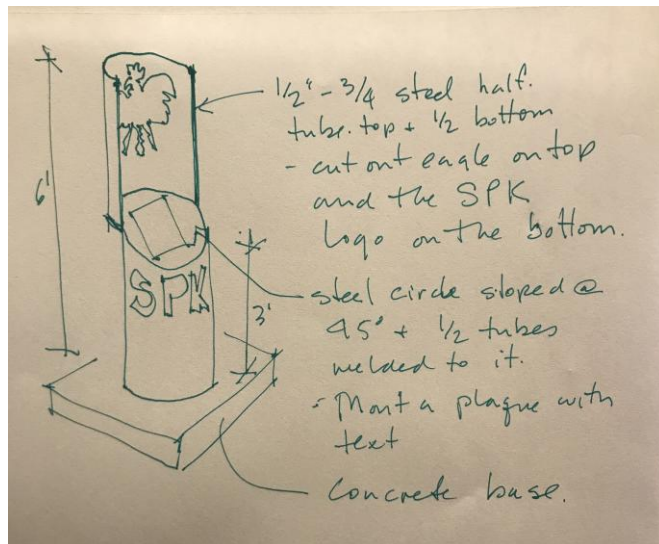
CONCEPT STATEMENT

The monument is a circular steel finish with a laser cut out of the Polish Eagle at the top, a sloped portion in the middle holding the commemorative plaque, and the lower portion has the Polish Flag.

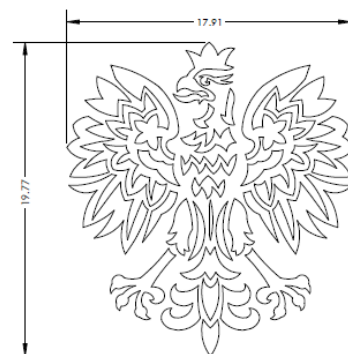
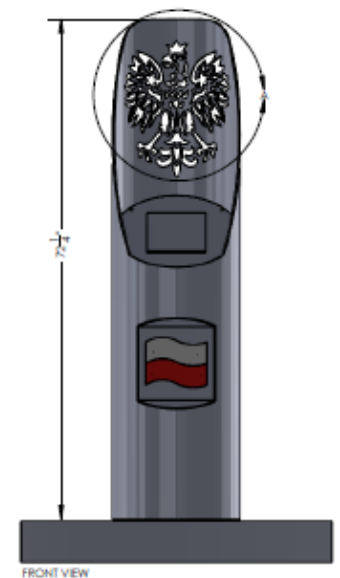
The steel rustic material symbolizes the hardship which the Polish veterans and displaced Polish individuals endured. The circular steel form reflects the barrel of the gun which forced the Polish persons from their homes.

The circular element symbolizes the unified strength of the Polish veterans and displaced Polish individual. The front sight of a gun, which is found at the end of the gun's barrel has been replaced by the laser cut Polish Eagle. This cut out eagle symbolizes what these residents focused on during their struggles, their continued focus on maintaining the Polish Culture in Saskatchewan, and their ability to see through the hardships to a better future for their family and community.
