On behalf of the Polish Canadian Cultural Club of Regina (PCCC), we are pleased to share details of a major commemorative project honouring Polish Veterans and Polish individuals displaced by WWI and WWII.

These individuals endured tremendous hardship and played a vital role in preserving and sharing Polish culture in Saskatchewan. To honour their legacy, the PCCC is creating a permanent memorial at Riverside Memorial Cemetery in Regina. This will be the first such monument in Saskatchewan

To bring this project to completion, we are seeking financial support from community members, organizations, and partners who wish to honour the contributions of these Veterans and displaced Poles.

All contributions are appreciated. Donations of \$100 or more will be acknowledged on a permanent display at St. Anthony's Parish Hall.

Proposed Memorial

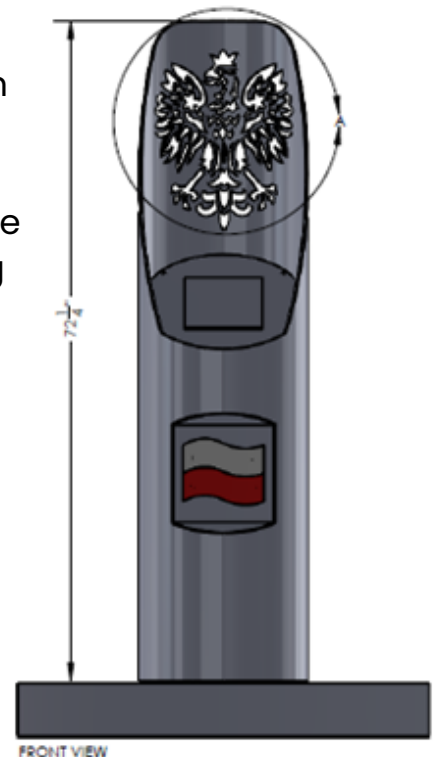
The overall size is 6ft (1.8m) tall and 18in (45.75cm) diameter. Steel fabrication on a concrete base, with laser cut Polish Eagle emblem.

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Appendix A: Naming Criteria & Submission Guidelines

- Platinum Sponsor – two (2) names
- Gold and Silver Sponsor – one (1) name

Polish Veteran

A person born in Poland who served in the Polish Army, Allied forces during WWI or WWII, or in the Polish underground. Please include photocopies of service documents or any available information confirming participation. The plaque will list any available details such as rank, name, identification number, battalion, conflict, and primary Saskatchewan residence.

Example:

- L/CPL. Name, 30068450, Polish 2nd Corps (WWII) – Canora & Regina

Polish Person Displaced by War

Individuals who were forcibly removed to labour camps, escaped during wartime, or left Poland prior to 1950 due to war-related circumstances and later settled in Saskatchewan. The plaque will list name, what occurred, and primary Saskatchewan residence.

Example:

- Name – deported to Siberia (WWII) – Prince Albert

Please note that each individual's name may appear only once on the memorial.
